

Outer Growth - Flesh vs Spirit 1 (the battle outside)

So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God Romans 8:8

The people that live according to sinful nature will not be able to please God. This includes those that accept Jesus Christ yet their lifestyle and preferences are carnal. To be 'in the flesh' is to be preoccupied with its desires, emotions, thoughts, and physical pleasures. This may involve adultery, hatred, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, and sexual immorality. Since God is the opposite of these things, how could it be possible for a person living in carnality please God? Forces are spiritual forces of evil that energize the ungodly carnally to oppose the will of God. Therefore, a fleshly believer will not be able to withstand the pressure of the enemy. Satan knows if an individual is living by carnal means because sin attracts one another. darkness blends together. The problem with a carnal believer is even though the desire to do good initially is there, sustaining fulfillment will be difficult because the battle of overcoming the demonic forces that control the body will

cause its members to yield. There is no opposing power of protection to stop that force of sinful activity.

Everyone that enters this life is born in sin. The moment the person comes into existence, the enemy is watching and waiting until they reach maturity to know good and evil. The devil precedes to entice the young person to find out their desires and dislikes and use these things as a weapon to counter whatever godly nature they may discover in their future. The eyes are the window of the soul. The obstacle for many believers in society today is to determine which Christians are real and not. If a believer is not deep in God, it is like the blind leading the blind and eventually will fall into the trap. To avoid these pitfalls is to know God for ourselves while abiding by His Word.
