Your Words. What we say on our behalf will either help us or hurt us. A person's own words may range from casual to careless remarks and will have to give an account on Judgement Day. However, the words we speak from our mouths about ourselves are from the heart that could impact our lives.

The words that come from yourself. All people will be accountable for the things they say. One of the reviews will be the words we spoke out of our mouths. There will be an audit for each person. The Son of God will examine each believer's words to determine what rewards will be given or withheld in eternity. This analysis does not mean exclusion from their eternal destiny, nor lose their salvation there.

The words that are attacking can emotionally damage others and ourselves. Communication that involves being angry is dangerous with word expression. A mad person may say hurtful words to another and might not mean it but will impact the one that receives it. Individuals with extreme rage could find themselves in serious trouble with the law because the words behind their actions may make the victim feel threatened. Some people will use words to express hate to others, and few will use words to disrespect victims. The words we say have power and could do good or not. We have to be careful when we say something on our behalf. Some things we say in certain situations could enslave us and not even know it. For example, if we pick up a glass to pour water into it, accidentally spill some on the floor, and reply, "why am I so clumsy?" This negative response could trigger such activity in situations like that. The correct reply should be, "look at that, I spilled some, I will be more careful next time." Words from the past may affect the present. The unfortunate things we did before, we should not let them hinder the present. For example, if we were mean toward others in the past and now made ourselves better, we should not say things like, "I was bad before you know." If you keep bringing the past life up now and then, it could create an unintentional reaction. We should rather say, "I am glad I am better now than before." Your words can carry weight. During these times, when he finished talking with her, he would continue as though she was still there, creating unnecessary drama. He would say things like, "You better not be cheating on me. I

hope I don't see a red corvette in the driveway!" This man enjoyed the commotion, only for the other workers to find out it was a prank.

However, one day, he did go home and saw a red corvette in the driveway. He was terrified. The man slowly went inside his house, and heard his wife laughing from the kitchen. Furious rage and emotion began to fume inside of Him. As he turned the corner to get into a fit, he was surprised by his wife and a lady sitting down having coffee and cake together. "Hi, honey!" My boss is celebrating her birthday today, so I invited her over. Is that okay? By the way, what's wrong?" All that build-up the man had inside of Him slowly subsided.
